
Ajosepo is a Nigerian word which means working together in friendship and as equal.


The feeding project in Dawhan, Ethopia. Every year a couple of thousand pounds is sent here to support this great cause. The following slides show the help St Genevieve's has given to those in Dawhan. We have even shared some stories the school staff have given to us.





The school re-opened in May 2023, this was led by the School Director with the support of the teaching staff. The Tigrayan authorities were keen to bring a measure of normality and stability and encourage the resumption of everyday life, hence the push to re-open the schools. The sisters were not able to be there due to continued insecurity. The staff have remained loyal and committed to the school and the parents too have engaged, some 105 children attending the re-opening. The school closed for summer on July 7th and will re-open again in September.

The classrooms were not broken into by the Eritreans, except the school kitchen that was destroyed and part of the roof in one the classrooms was shelled. Nearly all the windows in the classroom blocks and the dining room got cracked and some smashed as a result of the impact of the shelling. In fact the school compound was used as a base to carry out shelling of the surrounding areas. All the arranged stones that stood as a boundary wall to protect the children were dismantled to form a shield for the soldiers during the war. The projector for the school was taken and will in time need to be replaced.

Zimam is from Medi'a a short distance from Dawhan where she lives with her family. When the bombing started, she and the family would run to hide inside the drainage with the slab shielding them during the day and returned home at night for about three days. But when the bombing started at night the family members ran in different directions, in search of a safe place. Her husband ran to Alitena, she remained in Dawhan and the children to another place, as the bombing continued at night she ran to Alitena and there was no food there and with the constant bombing she ran to Ara'e and stayed there for three months and came back to Dawhan when things were better. Fuel was available for milling and people were able to get something to









Desta and Aster have completed their 4 year programme from 2017-2023 which was a 4 year upgrading course in Amharic language. Some glimmer of hope in very dark times.

Against all this very difficult backdrop, we are pleased to report that the professional development of two of the staff has been continued and will be of great value when the school resumes this September.

Lemlem is from Sabida a village behind the mountain near to the Sisters of St. Louis Convent. Lemlem has an aged mother who was sick, for safety from bombing she moved to Awo with her sick mother to a relation's house and met six other families who came to seek refuge from different places. There they were managing and eating together with the seven families. In a space of three weeks everything had finished and they were left with nothing to eat. The sick mother pleaded to be taken back to her house; she preferred to die in her home. They had to return to Sabida on her mother's request. They stayed at home running in and out to hide in the cave during the day time till the war ended.









Manna Sabhat is from Adaga about 2 hours walking distance from Dawhan. She was in Alitena for some days and she later went to Daya a village after Adaga; she thought the situation was improved and moved to Dawhan. Soon trouble started again in Dawhan, she too was finding refuge inside drainage for two days, the third day she ran to Atlitena, the same day Alitena bombing started she ran to Daya and discovered there was no food there so she ran back to Dawhan to get food at night because bombing was only at night. Unfortunately that night as she got to Alitena bombing started she couldn't get to Dawhan she ran into a cave and stayed till morning and continued to Dawhan to get food and walked back to Daya two days after in the night. Daya too was also under attack with bombing, she ran to Sengede, a desert and stayed three weeks there before coming back to her house in Dawhan.

The parents are to serve as guides to their children into the way of light (Jesus) which is a symbol of the lighted candles.









The children always look forward for school days because of the nourishments they get from school. Many of their homes cannot provide and not happy when weekends approach for the meals they will miss. Many children always hide from their parents anything that will stop them from going to school especially when they are sick want to be in school.

What a happy and great day for the children who specifically requested for spaghetti on graduation day. Parents were happy with stories from the children how they have been feeding well even before the graduation day. Families are experiencing a hard time, the after effects of the war left many homes only eat once a day and in the school they were getting biscuits during break and meal at lunch time.

Ajosepo-St. Genevieve's is the reason for the children's motivation and looking forward to go to school with their funding for food program.




